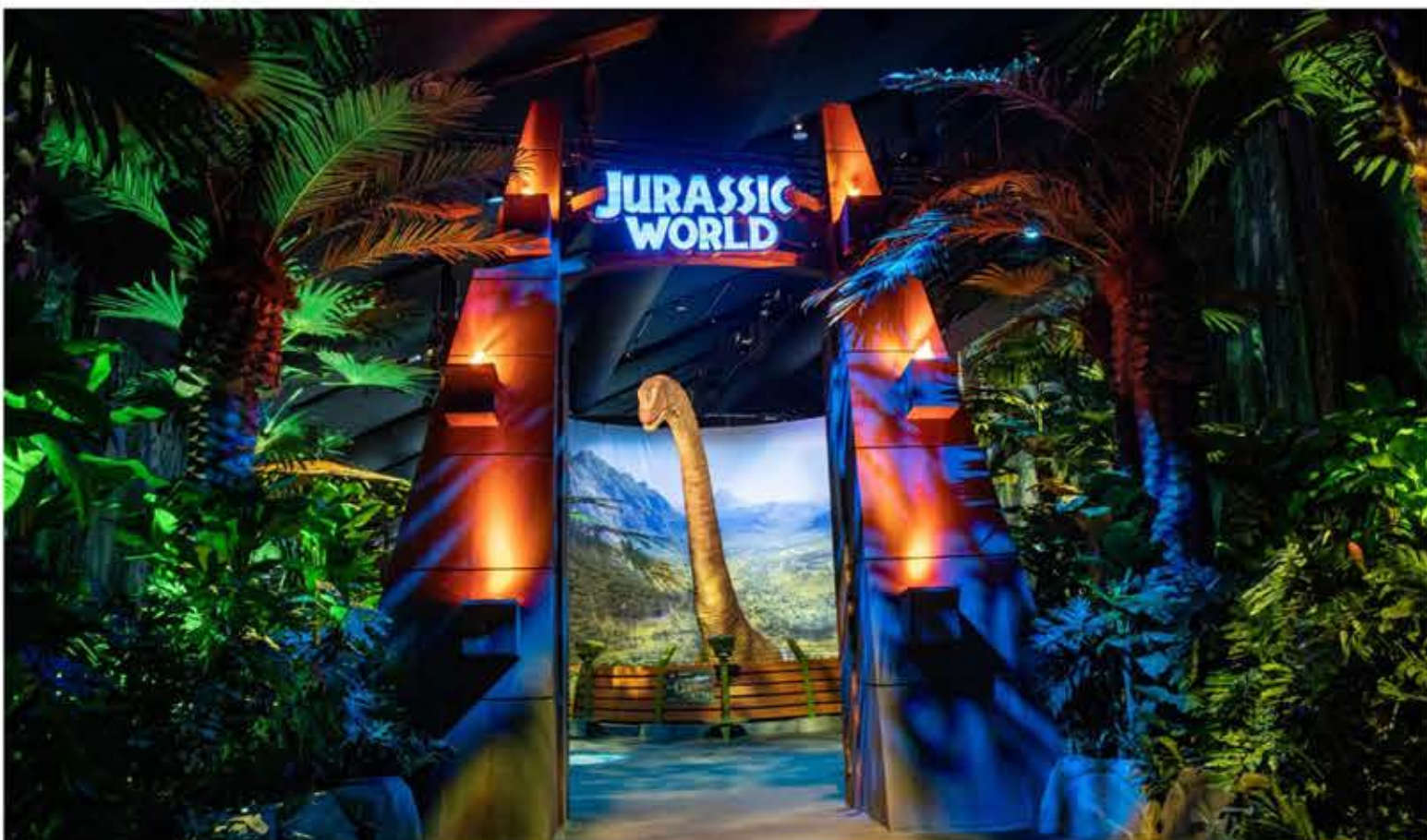


Jurassic World: The Exhibition is coming back to Melbourne this year



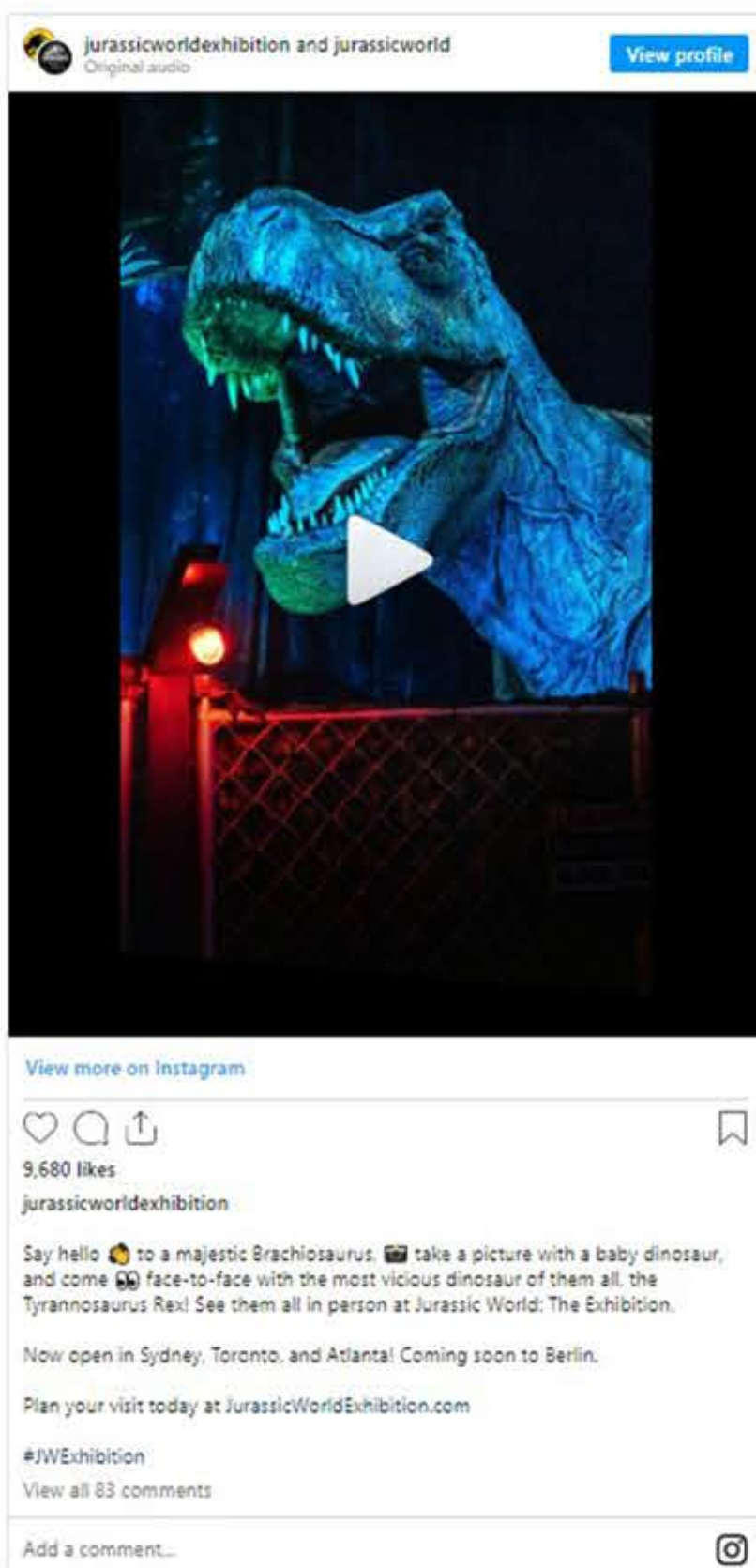
